Our European Neighbours

<p>Reading</p> <p>We will begin our class reading of 'The Lion the Witch and the Wardrobe'. Our first 'VIPERS' (Vocabulary, Inference, Prediction, Explanation, Retrieval and Summarising) skill will be prediction. We will work on using details stated to make informed predictions.</p> 	<p>Writing</p> <p>In English lessons, we take inspiration from the text 'The Tin Forest' to write descriptions of the two different forests from the viewpoint of the old man. We will also write a non-chronological report about a European city we have studied in Geography.</p>	<p>Maths</p> <p>This half term we will work on place value of numbers up to 10,000. We will also further develop our addition and subtraction skills using formal written methods.</p>
<p>Geography</p> <p>This half term, we will use atlases to locate key countries and capital cities in Europe. We will draw comparisons between our local area and a region in France and make links between the size of mountains and rivers in the UK compared to those in Europe.</p>	<p>PSHE (Personal, Social, Health Education)</p> <p>This half term the theme is 'Healthy Relationships.' This will involve, looking at how we can respond to and read people's body language and our understanding of the term bullying.</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>In addition to our educational visit to Southampton Art Gallery, in class we will be giving our own opinions of art created by different European Artists, learning to tint, shade and add texture to paints and producing a final painted landscape piece.</p>
<p>French</p> <p>In French our topic will be 'fruits', we will look at naming fruits and constructing simple sentences about fruits we like and dislike.</p>	<p>Games and PE</p> <p>In Games, we will be further developing some of our athletic skills we learnt last year. In our PE lessons, we will explore the school grounds by completing different orienteering challenges.</p>	<p>D&T</p> <p>In our DT lessons our focus will be on food and nutrition. We will explore popular European pizza styles and their main ingredients and then design and make a pizza considering the nutritional value and seasonality of toppings.</p>
<p>Science</p> <p>In Science, we will be learning about digestions. We will learn about the main food group and their functions in our bodies and what a balanced diet looks like. We will then look at how different animals require different foods to survive.</p>	<p>RE (Religious Education)</p> <p>Our concept in RE is teaching; we will be learning about how teaching is shown in the lives of Buddhists.</p>	<p>Music</p> <p>Throughout the year in Year 4, we will have lessons run by Hampshire music called 'Listen to Me'. This half term we will be learning to play brass instruments.</p>
