



Sports Premium Statement 2019 - 2020

The Sports Premium is used to fund additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport, for the benefit of our pupils, and to encourage the development of healthy, active lifestyles.

Our Sports team (member of the teaching staff leading PE, Sports Coach and a Play Leader) are working together to implement the stated targets on our school Sports and PE action plan to further develop PE provision in school.

There are 5 indicators that schools should expect to see improvements across:

- 1) The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- 2) The profile of physical education, sport and physical activity (PESPA) being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
- 3) Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- 4) Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
- 5) Increased participation in competitive sport.

What was the impact of the funding for 2018 – 2019?

The impact from a sports coach working with staff has increased subject knowledge for teachers alongside improved confidence and competence. Staff have been able to observe the sports coach and also teach alongside them thus refining their own skills.

Children have benefited with this provision allowing us to target any children who show a particular talent, increasing our participation, and success, at inter-school competition level.

We were successful in taking three teams to the Hampshire games this year who won:

Gold – Year 3 / 4 tri golf.

Silver – Year 5 / 6 tri golf.

Bronze - Girls football

The school once again awarded Gold in the School Games Mark and won ‘School of the Year’ in the primary section for PE within the borough of Eastleigh.

Swimming and water safety in school

Each pupil is required to be able to do the following:

- Perform safe self rescue in different water based situations
- Swim competently, confidently and proficiency over a distance of at least 25 meters.
- Use a range of strokes effectively, for example, front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.

Swimming is taught in year 5. The number of those who meet the national Curriculum requirements: 80 pupils which equates to 89% of the cohort.
